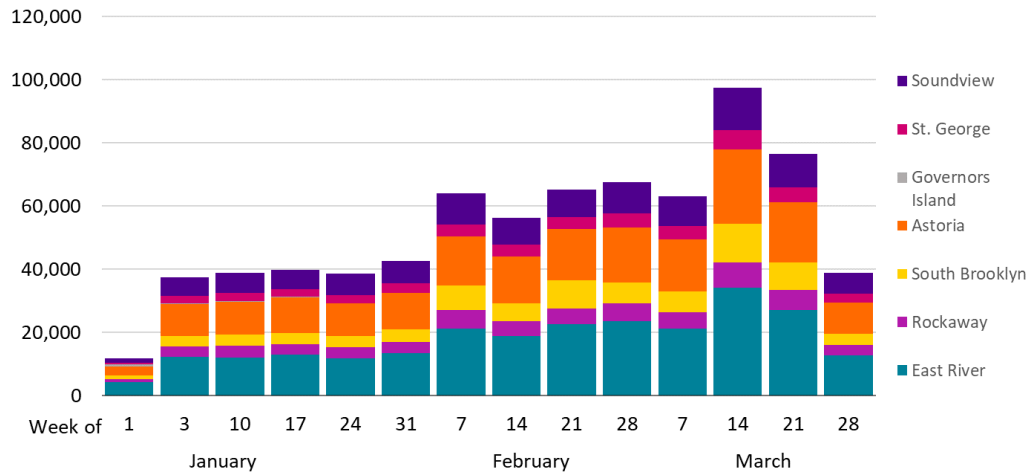

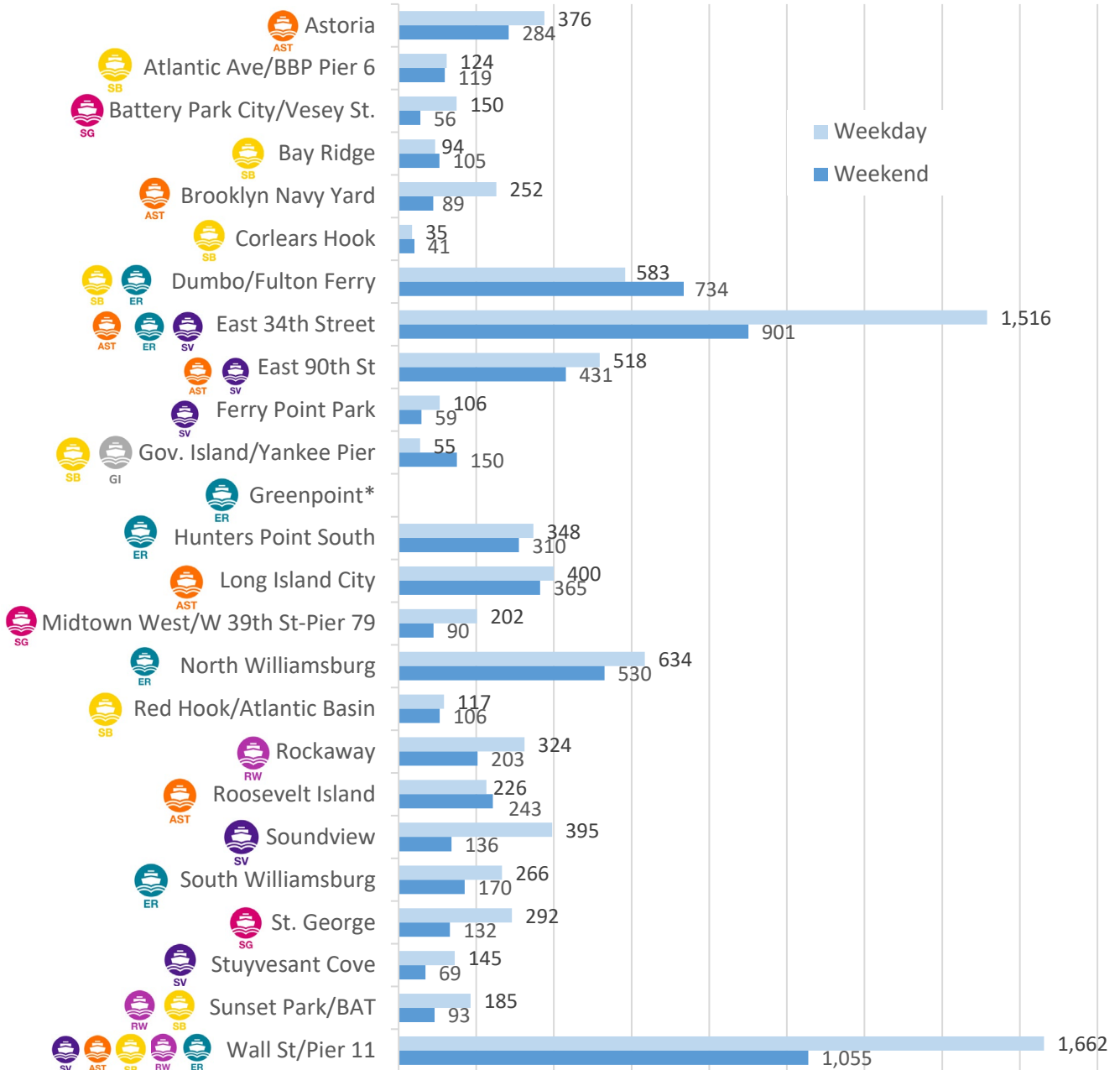

Highlights

NYC Ferry ridership recovery was impacted by the Omicron variant in January and February. By March, weekly ridership recovery rebounded to 2019 levels in certain weeks.



Service Notes

The Greenpoint landing remained closed in Q1. Winter schedule began on January 24th and Governors Island was added to the South Brooklyn route. NYC Ferry did not operate on 1/29/2022 due to blizzard conditions.

¹On Time Performance is calculated as the percentage of trips that departed no more than 1 minute before and arrive no more than 5 minutes past their scheduled times at each landing. This report does not include delays due to events outside of the control of NYC Ferry, such as vessel traffic, river closures/obstructions, extreme weather conditions, and other U.S. Coast Guard restrictions. When tracking devices are offline, the stops are excluded from the calculation. ²Number of NYCF-branded vessels available for use.
